RTIP ALUM SPEAKS WITH CURRENT STUDENTS



Tucson, AZ — Michael Weiss took some time out of his busy schedule to talk with students in the Racing Business, Strategies & Global Perspectives class on Tuesday afternoon about Advanced Deposit Wagering (ADW) and his experience in the racing industry.

Weiss started off by giving a brief resume and then going into detail about the history and progression of the ADW business. He talked about how he was involved with developing one of the first wagering websites-America Tab. He discussed in detail the technology they had to utilize and what steps had to be taken to make the idea a reality.

Students participated in the discussion throughout the lecture as they brought up different ideas of where they think technology is headed in respect to racing. They discussed different rates, learned more about rebates and how they work, and new ideas that could be implemented in the future.

Weiss also talked about his current work with Rillito Park Race Track in Tucson, AZ and discussed a similar project that he headed in North Dakota. Students were eager to hear about his plans for the track and to offer their help on the project.
