### **Ontario Horse Racing Statistics**

### 2012

- 3 breeds (Standardbred, Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse)
- Around 1,600 race dates (over 900 in 2013)
- 16 racetracks across our Province (over 668,841 sq. miles)
- \$935MM legally wagered in Ontario on horse racing (estimating \$865MM in 2013)
- 20,000 Licensees
- Over 1,300 Rulings
- Ontario represents about two-thirds of Canada's wagering

## Central Adjudication (CA) Room



- Steward/Judge at HQ, using real time technology
- Central Steward/Judge participates in the deliberations with two track-based officials in making decisions
- Reduction of personnel at track = modest cost savings

# Equine Medication Control: A CPMA-ORC Partnership

### Canadian Pari-Mutuel Agency:

- Race Day testing program
- Oversight of TCO2 testing program
- Research & science

### ORC

- Adjudication of certificate of positive test
- Sharing of resources and intelligence
- Out-of-competition testing

## Pilot Program – Sample Collection

- TCO2 (blood) samples taken prior to race
- CPMA drug samples (blood or urine) taken post-race
- Pilot collection of both samples at the same time (pre-race) by same technician in paddock stall
- Selected horses may be subject to post-race test
- Done in consultation with horsepeople, track, service provider

## **Equine Medication Control**

### Challenges:

- Shift from backstretch to private training centres
- Substances where benefits are longer lasting than elimination time


### **Out-of-Competition Testing:**

- Complements race date testing procedures
- Only with "reasonable grounds"
- Intelligence-based
- 2012: 37 occurrences (2013 = 26 YTD)


